

AGENT ORANGE AND VA CLAIMS UPDATE

Much information about Agent Orange exposure and finding out if any diseases or health problems Sabalo sailors have contracted is related has been included in past issues. However, some basic questions still are being asked, so I am including some of the basic stuff for review. Unfortunately, many men have passed on from maladies that are now being presumed to have cause relating to exposure. Many, including your editor, are fighting to get recognition for VA disability claims under the specificity of the law.

The first act of Congress recognizing Agent Orange exposure is The Blue Water Navy (BWN) Vietnam Veterans Act of 2019 (PL 116-23 *LINK*) extended the presumption of herbicide exposure, such as Agent Orange, to Veterans who served in the offshore waters of the Republic of Vietnam between Jan. 9, 1962 and May 7, 1975. These waters are specified via numerous lines of demarcation which are basically 12 miles from the eastern coast of VN and as much as 30 from the southern coast.

The Promise to Address Comprehensive Toxins (PACT) Act. is Part of USC Title 38 Part 3 <u>LINK</u>. The PACT Act is a law that expands VA health care and benefits for Veterans exposed to burn pits, Agent Orange, and other toxic substances. For a complete explanation of benefits <u>use this link on the VA site</u>.

The reports of Sabalo vets I have heard from is that men from the deployments of 1962, 1965 & 1970 have been approved for disabilities. One man has provided an excerpt from his claim approval that also indicates visits to Thailand were approved, but it is not clear of the date. In the latter case this would also seemingly include the visit in 1969, but my claim was just recently denied again. [-ed.]



Wildfire Damages Navy Base on Remote California Island; Live Fire Suspected

For nine decades, **San Clemente Island**, the southernmost of the eight Channel Islands, has been owned by the Navy and is largely inaccessible to civilians. Throughout this time the volcanic isle's sprawling shoreline and rolling hills have served as a crucial military training ground where U.S. troops detonate grenades and fire heavy artillery. It's also the Navy's last live-firing range for ship-to-shore bombardments. The conflagration left 13,000 acres of the southern end of the island charred, and numerous Navy buildings without power.

That was 13,674 sailors below what the Navy said was needed. Greg was born 21 July 1939.

He was Received For Duty on Sabalo 14 Dec 57 from NTC San Diego CA as SN (USNR). He was age 18 1/2 at that time.

On 24 Sep 58 He Qualified in submarines and changed designation to SS. Like many eager sailors, he worked hard and became an integral member of the crew. As one of younger men among the crew, he became the leading seaman in the deck aana.

After 20 months aboard, and at the rank of TMSN(SS), he was Transferred 26 Jul 59 to Recruiting Station San Francisco CA pending release to inactive status.

His bio submitted 2005 for the 302 website: "My shipmate and buddy, Jeff Stockton* and I went to Roosevelt High School in Seattle together, and I was the guy who talked him into joining the Submarine Service after graduation. (I don't think he ever forgave me for that one.) We went from cancer. He is survived by his wife, Hope, to boot camp and Sub school together, and both got assigned to the Sabalo in Pearl Harbor. We went through all the fun stuff of the boat's ops in the Cold War in the 1950's together. We graduated from Sabalo and went to the University of Washington together...and actually joined

He later worked in Public Relations with several major oil companies.

Greg died 4 Nov 2024 in Bainbridge Island, WA who he married in April 1968, and sons Kyle and Cameron and their wives and children.

He was a member of USSVI in the USS Parche Base.

Lester Joslin Receives Award for Services

Word has been received in Prineville [OR] this week that. Lester Joslin, Signalman 3/c, United States Navy, has received a citation "for excellent service". Mrs. Joslin is the former Virginia Eaton, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. M. D. Eaton of Prineville.

The citation follows: "USS Tennessee, c/o Fleet Post Office, San Francisco, California. The commanding officer commends Lester Merel Joslin, Signalman Third Class (T) V6, United States Naval Reserve, for service as set forth in the following citation: For excellent service in the line of duty during an air attack, on 12 April 1945, in which a Japanese suicide plane crashed into his ship. By his prompt and efficient action, he contributed materially in minimizing the damage to his ship by fighting and extinguishing fires in the damaged areas. 'His conduct gives evidence of his value to the naval service."

The base has an inside area of 270,000 sq. ft., beneath 899 ft of hard rock, including 140,000 sq ft of housing, and 32,000 sq ft of deep-water dock. There is an internal dry dock capable of accommodating 6 submarines simultaneously. The base further consists of workshops, offices and ammunition depots. The base also has external docks capable of accommodating larger ships, among other US Navy SSN's and SSBN's. The entrance to the facilities consist of a tunnel that is more than 3,000 ft long.

Did Norway Sell a Secret Military Base to Russia?

The claim that Norway sold the military base to Russia is disinformation. In 2013, the Olavsvern military base was decommissioned, and the facility was bought by a Norwegian private investment group. Realizing the future importance of the facility, it later came back under government cognizance and about 2020 secret plans and utilizations began by the U.S.



HEADLINE NEWS — Two Veterans Will Argue to Supreme Court that VA Disability Claims Aren't Getting 'Benefit of Doubt' 15 Oct 2024 In the case Bufkin v. McDonough, the plaintiffs challenged decisions by the VA and the U.S. Court of Appeals for Veterans Claims denying benefits for health conditions. They argue that the Veterans Board of Appeals, and later, the ap-

peals court, failed to apply a "benefit-of-the-doubt" rule that should have resulted in disability compensation awards. "Modern science has transformed the treatment of HIV, and this court has already ruled that asymptomatic HIV-positive service members with undetectable viral loads who maintain treatment are capable of performing all of their military duties, including worldwide deployment," Judge Leonie Brinkema wrote in a 38page opinion in the Eastern District Court of Virginia. Brinkema is the same judge who ruled in 2022 that the military could not deny commissions to HIV-positive service members who sought to become officers or discharge those with HIV.

The cases included two airmen facing discharge as a result of their HIV-positive status and an Army National Guard soldier who deployed to Afghanistan and Kuwait while in law school and wanted to become a member of the Army Judge Advocate General Corps.

Shortly after Brinkema released her 2022 opinion, Defense Secretary Lloyd Austin issued a memo to commanders saying they no longer would be allowed to involuntarily separate troops with asymptomatic HIV; restrict them from deploying; or prevent enlisted personnel, cadets or midshipmen with HIV from seeking a commission as an officer.

Improvements in antiretroviral therapy have made it possible for patients with the virus to keep their viral loads to low or undetectable levels. At such amounts, HIV -positive persons don't transmit the virus through sex or needle sharing, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, and it cannot be spread through saliva, tears or sweat. <u>https://www.military.com/dailynews/2024/08/23/military-cant-keep-hiv-positive-americansenlisting-federal-judge-rules.html</u>


